## A Word from....



#### **Umpire's Corner**

In Section 2 of the Law Book attention is drawn to some of the game anomalies that may affect play. <u>Have you seen a player or team play two</u> <u>bowls in succession?</u> This can occur if a player plays out of turn. If the bowl is still in motion the opposing skip can stop the bowl and return it to the player to play it in the proper order; (Law 29.1.1)

If the bowl has already come to rest without disturbing the head the opposing skip must choose whether to (a) leave the head as it is and have their team play two bowls one after the other to get back to the proper order of play: (*Law 29.1.2.1*) or (b) return the bowl and get back to the proper order of play; (*Law 29.1.2.2*). However if the bowl has disturbed the head, there are three options. Read these in the Law Book under 29.1.3.

This rule is slightly different in a singles game. If a bowl has been played by each player before the players discover that one of them has played out of turn, play in that end must continue in that order. *(Law 29.1.4).* 

The rules can be 'full of surprises'! Did you know that you can go to the Bowls NZ website - click on Bowls Hub > then Umpires Hub > you can try out one of the Quizzes. There are usually 3 quizzes and the questions change from time to time. You will enjoy them.
